

Employer Tree Test Key Insights

Respondents failed 7 of the 10 tasks

Employer comments from recent survey

"I'm extremely disappointed in the changes you've made to the website. It most definitely IS NOT, user friendly!!!!"

"There' is a lot of information accessible online but it doesn't seem to be organized in a way that makes it easy for me to find what I want."

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Conduct focus groups with employers to explore new navigation
- Tree test proposed navigation
- Suggested solutions: Include "signposts" and "scent trails" in new website design to help employers find information quickly

Employer comments from recent survey

"Please update your website more quickly."

"The website is very clunky with a less than optimal user experience."

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Overview

- New navigation for the employer section has been proposed by the internal Employer team.
- The proposed navigation was "tree tested", like a card sort, using Optimal Workshop.
- 44 Ohio employers participated and 35 (80%) of those completed all 10 tasks.

Goals

• Determine if employers can find information using the proposed navigation

Task 1 You need to complete a Workers' Compensation application for coverage, and you want to know if you can do this online.

- 86% (30 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 14% (5 of 35) of respondents failed

Task 2 Where would you go to find out information about reporting payroll?

- 83% (29 of 35) of respondents failed
- 17% (6 of 35) of respondents skipped

Task 3 Where would you go to watch a video on preventing food service injuries?

- 83% (29 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 17% (6 of 35) of respondents failed

Task 4 You are a new employer and want to know if you need to obtain Workers' Compensation Coverage?

- 29% (10 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 71% (25 of 35) of respondents failed

Task 5 You suspect a physician is billing BWC for treatments he is not performing, and you want to report this.

- 78% (27 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 20% (7 of 35) of respondents failed
- 3% (1 of 35) of respondents skipped

Task 6 Where would you go to learn the requirements to be a self-insured employer?

- 25% (9 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 74% (26 of 35) of respondents failed

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Task 7 Where would you go to find information about drug free safety grants?

- 72% (25 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 43% (15 of 35) of respondents failed

Task 8 You are taking several employees out of state to work a job. Where would you go to find out what you need to do to ensure those employees are covered?

- 17% (6 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 81% (28 of 35) of respondents failed
- 3% (1 of 35) of respondents skipped

Task 9 Where would you go to find the safety council in your area?



Task 10 Your employee was injured at work. Where would you go to find information on what you should do next?


- 19% (7 of 35) of respondents succeed
- 81% (24 of 35) of respondents failed










Where would you go to find out information about reporting payroll?








Where would you go to watch a video on preventing food service injuries?











Where would you go to learn the requirements to be a self-insured employer?




Where would you go to find more information about drug free safety grants?









Overview

BWC users adapted to the current website design by calling the call center for help finding information on the website.


Suggested solutions for the new website design include:

Common searches, also called scent trails, which can help employers find information quickly.






Trending Searches Example
